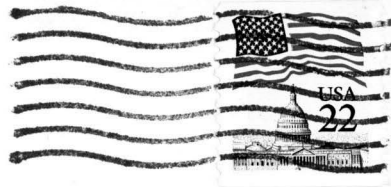
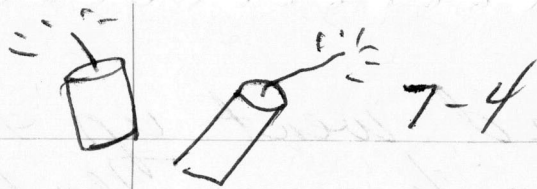

FREDERICK O. PEAKE  
KENTUCKY  
GM3 US NAVY  
WORLD WAR II  
JULY 16 1921 - NOV 14 1942
